Roseola

Please be aware we have a confirmed diagnosis of Roseola in your child's classroom. Roseola is a viral infection causing fever or rash in infants and children that primarily occurs between 6 and 24 months of age.

Symptoms

- High fever lasting 3 to 7 days.
- Red, raised rash lasting from hours to several days.
- No symptoms, not every child will have a fever and a rash.

Roseola is spread through respiratory droplets when a child talks, coughs, or sneezes. Also, from contact with secretions from objects contaminated by the droplets.

A child may return to care if the fever has been resolved for 24 hours without fever reducing medications and the child is able to participate in activity.

This is a reminder to keep sick children home where they can rest and get well.
